- PhD in a relevant field
- Substantial university- or college-level teaching experience in public health, the social and structural determinants of health, or a related discipline
- Demonstrated ability to teach across undergraduate and graduate programs in both online and in-person settings
- Experience with course development, curriculum design, and Universal Design for Learning (UDL)
- Demonstrated commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion, including respect for Indigenous ways of knowing and being, and evidence of social justice and/or anti-racist approaches to teaching and learning

- Demonstrated capacity to work collaboratively and participate in the life of the school, including serving on campus-based committees, curriculum working groups and participating in on campus extra-curricular student events
- Experience working with the health or social services sector, in public health and/or health policy roles; and/or health policy experience
- The following is considered an asset: experience with student mentorship and supervision (e.g., research, practicum)
